










# Panel Discussion Topic of Diversity And Inclusion : Emerging Strategy For Equal Employment Opportunity on Jan 9th 2024

As per etiquette the Seminar had a key note address by the Chief Guest Mr. V. Nandakumar, IRS, Commissioner of Income Tax, Dept. of Revenue, Ministry of Finance, Government of India. He recounted his personal journey and imparted profound insights regarding the ramifications that his vision of a \$5 Trillion Economy would impose on pivotal sectors of India, including manufacturing, agriculture, and services. Additionally, he elaborated on critical facets of these sectors that require attention as India strives to attain the objective of a \$5 trillion economy.



Subsequently Dr.M.Sumathy, Dean - School of Commerce,
Bharathiyar University, Coimbatore, delivered special address stating the importance of the day and this seminar where academicians, researchers, eminent guests have come together to deliberate and share their thoughts on "India's \$ 5 Trillion economy: the vision, challenges and roadmap." She discussed the crucial contribution that diverse sectors will make towards the realization of this vision. She touched up-

on various aspects like Blue economy, Water conservation, Clean India, Healthy India, Infrastructure, Solar energy, and stressed on the need for a coordinated effort towards Nation building.

The Co- Convener of the seminar, Dr. T. Dhanabalan, Associate Professor, Presidency Business School, Bengaluru outlined the goal of the seminar, the number of papers to be presented, the presenting schedule, and the day's itinerary. It was followed by vote of thanks for the inaugural session.



First Technical Session\_started at 11.30 am and was chaired by Dr. G. Yoganandham, Professor & Head of Economics, Thiruvalluvar University, Vellore, Dr.Rajitha, Assistant Professor, Presidency Business School, Bengaluru acted as a Rapporteur for this Technical Session. The session was marked by a diverse range of presentations from total of seven contributors, encompassing PG students, research scholars, and faculty members. The papers presented delved into crucial aspects aligned with the seminar's theme, covering sectors such as agricultural advancements, digital transformation, infrastructural development, MSME industry dynamics, Role of women, and Strategies for unlocking India's potential on its journey towards a \$5 Trillion Economy. The session chair provided constructive feedback, emphasizing the need for participants to probe deeper into the challenges faced within their respective domains. Dr. Durai Raj also contributed valuable insights, encouraging presenters to provide more in-depth analyses for a comprehensive understanding of the topics presented. At 1:00 PM, the first technical session came to a conclusion, and there was a lunch break.

At 2 P.M the Second Technical Session started with the Session Chair Prof. K. Sivachithappa, Professor of Economics, University of Mysore, Former Registrar, Tumkur University, Karnataka and Dr. Indumathi R Nagesh, Associate Professor, Presidency Business School, Bengaluru as Rapporteur. The session emphasized on the impact of agriculture on \$5 Trillion Economy, the discussion revolved around how agriculture generates \$400 billion for the Indian economy, second only to China. To achieve this enormous national aim, agriculture, industry, and services must flourish. The session was interactive with lots of queries and observations by the participants. Six papers were presented in this session and the session was concluded at 3.30 P.M.

Third Technical Session started in parallel at 2 PM with the Session Chair Dr.Inayath Ahamed, Kalasalingam Business School, Kalasalingam University and Dr.Satarupa Misra, Assistant Professor, Presidency Business School, Bengaluru as Rapporteur. Researchers presented papers on the theme pivotal role of technology in Indian economic growth. Few presenters highlighted economic benefits of globalization that would lead to \$5Trillion economy. The session also pointed out on how innovation can lead to India's economic renaissance. A total of 11 papers were presented in this session. There were a number of questions posed by the participants and audience, making the session lively.

Fourth Technical Session also started in parallel at 2. 
#### GAIN MORE KNOWLEDGE


