On 20th July 2024, Rotaract Club of Presidency College held its flagship project, Ashraya, at Parvathi Charitable Trust.

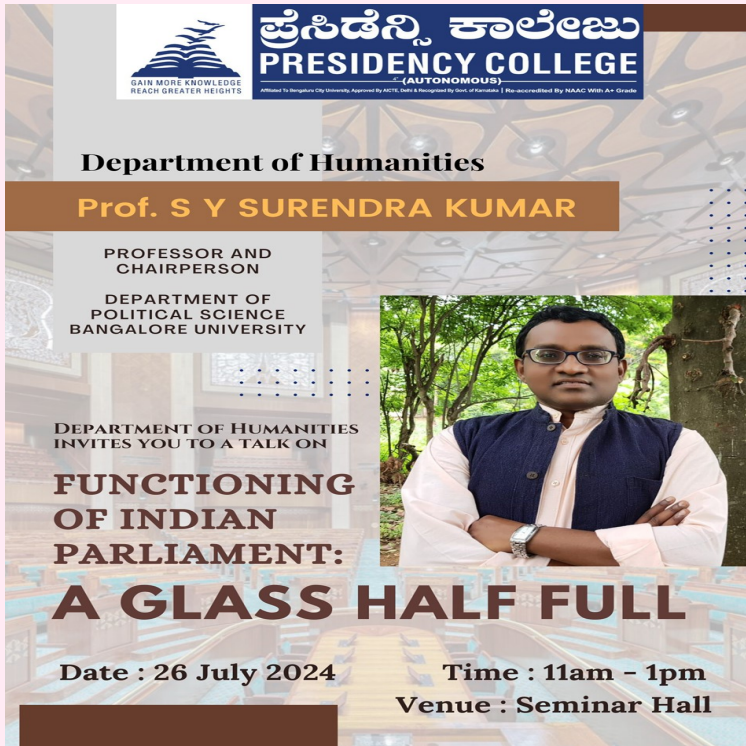
At 12:00 PM, our members arrived and engaged deeply with the elderly residents. They shared personal stories about their grandparents and listened attentively to the residents' life experi-

and the many ways our vote matters and the ways certain policies are implemented.

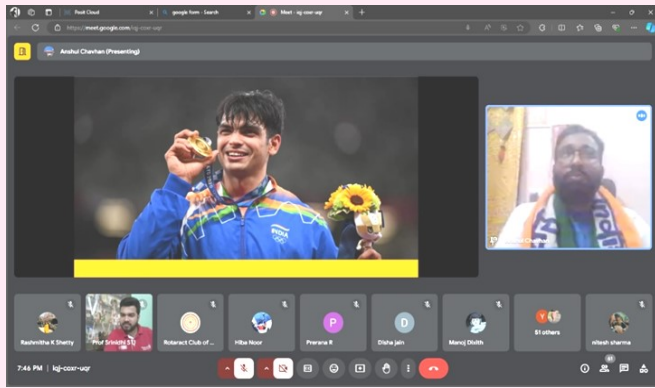
As the lecture progressed the resource person shed light on various Committees and Private bills and Ordinances and how they work in part with the constitution.

Overall, it was an interactive and highly engaging panel discussion.



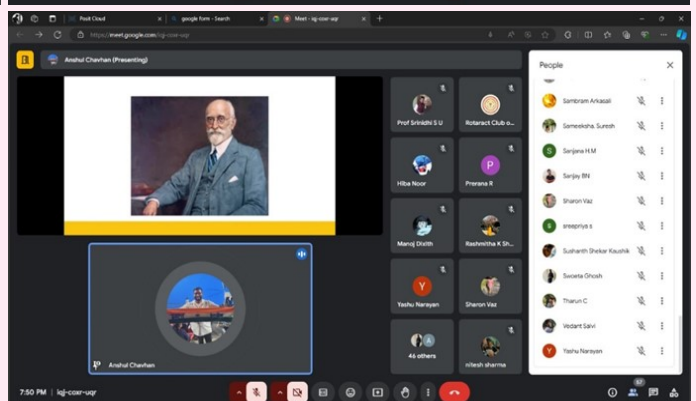
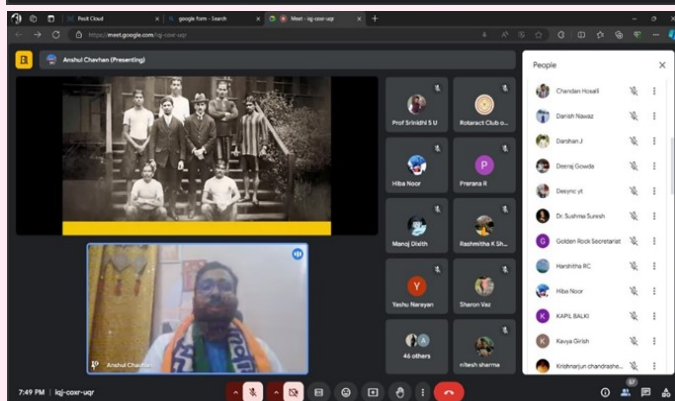
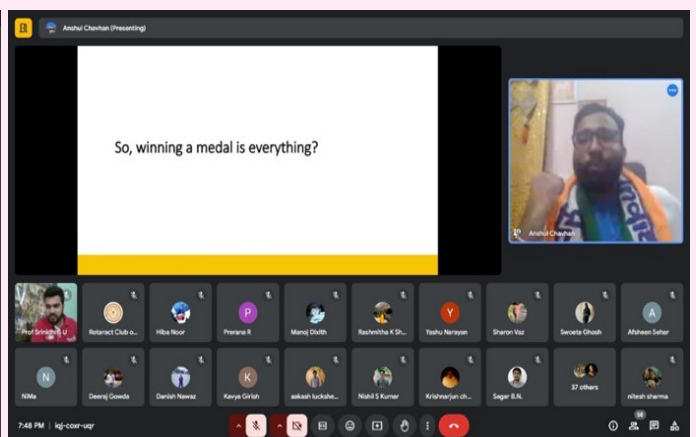
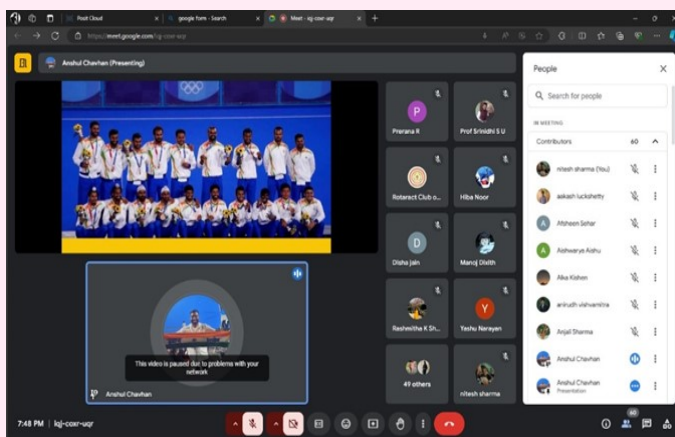
Legacy of India in Olympics and Way Forward on 28/07/2024

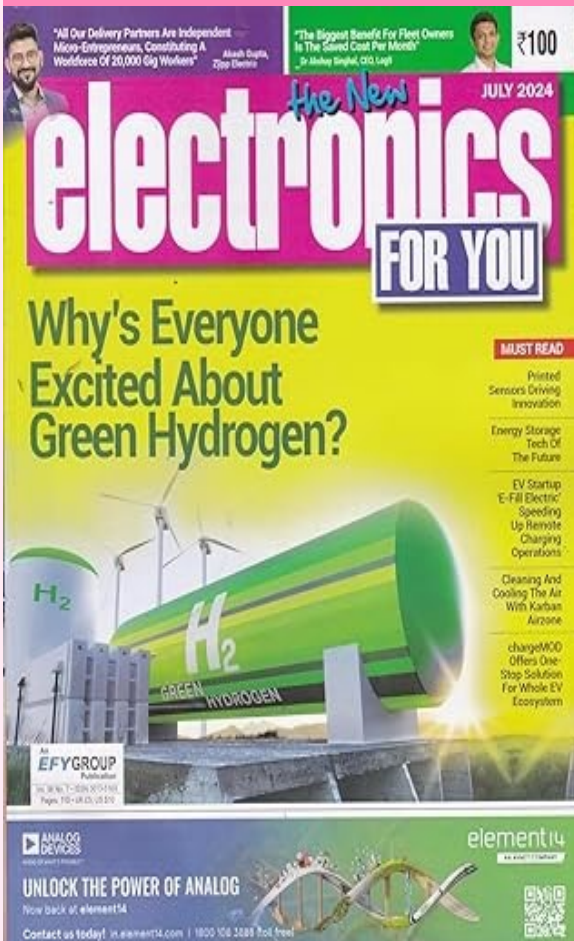

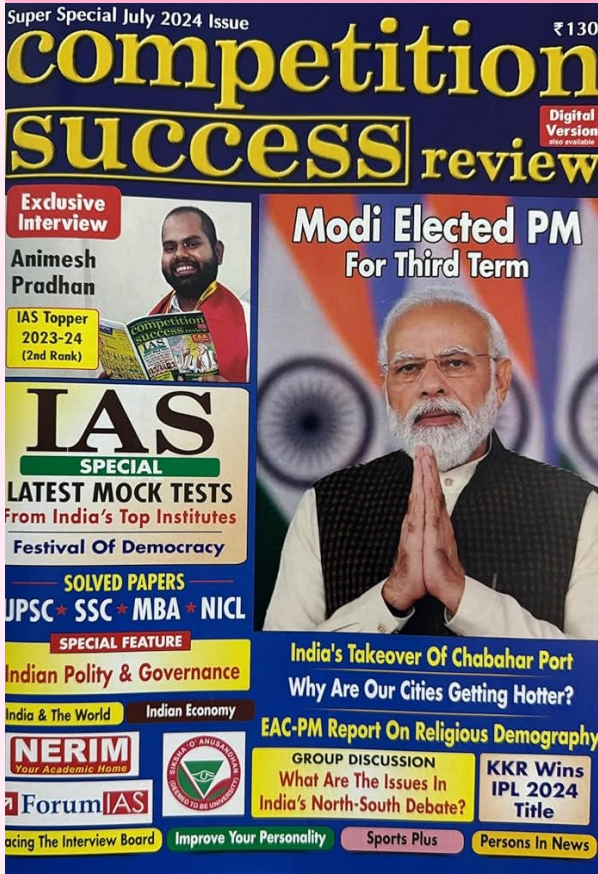

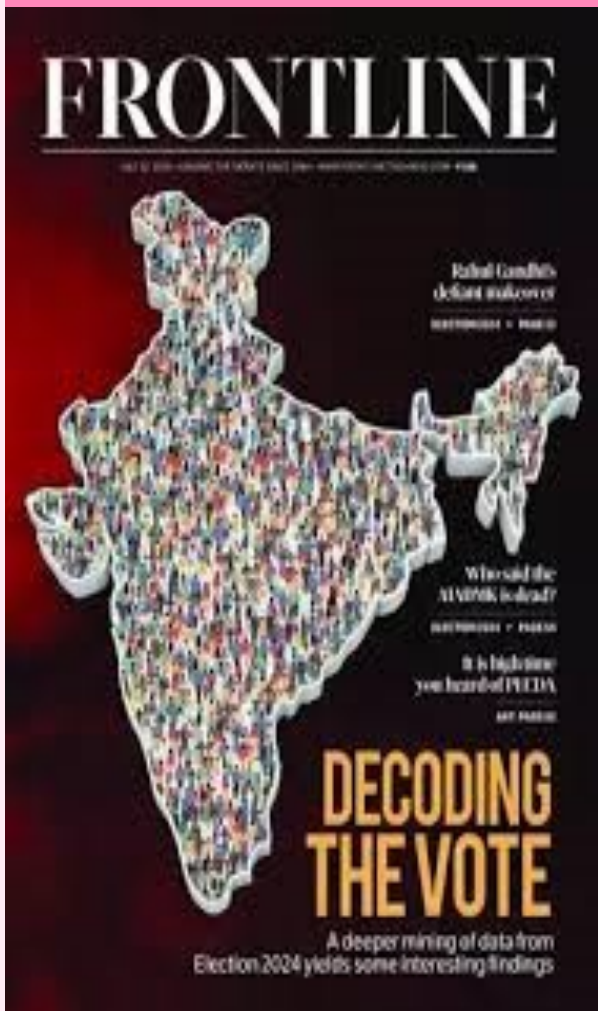
The Pen is Mightier than the Sword:
