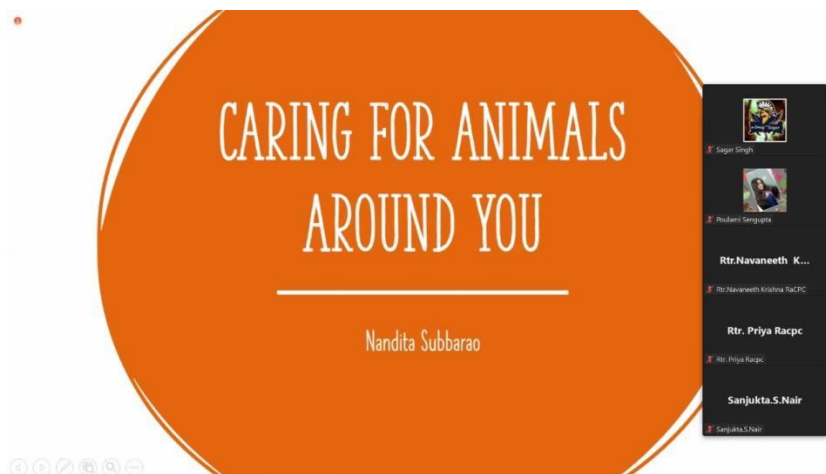

CARING FOR YOUR PET

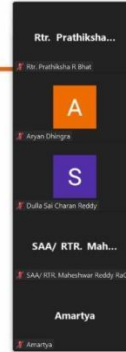
Dogs

- Do not chain them
- Walk them on a leash¹
- Learn when to let go

Cats

- Keep them indoors.
- Build a mesh enclosure where feasible.
- Vaccinate and deworm regularly
- Neuter!
